Gentlemen of the Class of 69,

The fall semester that started 20 August has passed all too quickly by. Finals were over last Friday and students are returning home for a well-deserved break from their studies and a Happy Holiday season. And once again a year is coming to an end and I failed to get this letter out to you earlier... my apologies.

Since my last letter of 8 May (a long time ago), here are a few of the College highlights:

- The 424 Day of Giving broke all previous records
- On 12 May, 184 seniors graduated. In 6 months 98.3% had first destinations
- Big Bash 24 saw 300+ alumni returning to campus.
- On 30 June the College closed out fiscal year 24 with a record year of giving
- On 17 August President Feller rang in the Class of '28 with 267 young men.
- The September student census showed 882 students attending best since 2018
- Wabash set a new record for freshman-to-sophomore retention at 93%.
- In Sept the College had 12 top-10 ranking in the Princton Review, to include No.2 nationally for internship opportunities, No. 4 for its alumni network, No.5 for financial aid, career services, and great professors with easy access.

Fiscal Year 24 closed out 30 June with \$52.7 m received in gifts and \$3.808 m for the annual fund. There were 4,909 alumni donors with a 40.25% participation, exceeding 40% for the 11th year in a row. A very special thank you to all who made a gift(s) to Wabash.

Class of 2028 with 257 is the largest freshmen class since 2018 (pre-Covid). The students came from 18 states and 14 countries. This the largest group of foreign students Wabash has had. We wish them well in their four-year journey through a rigorous liberal arts education.

The fall census in Sept indicated 184 seniors, 220 juniors, 221 sophomores, and 257 freshmen for a total enrollment or 882, the highest enrollment since 2018.

Dean Moore Scholarship:

Our 424 Day of Giving Dean Moore Challenge received 73 donors – a record. The gifts received on 424 and through fiscal year 24 ending on 30 June, brought our Dean Moore book value up to \$873, 711. The gifts of \$16.3k to our DM fund from 1 July to 1 Dec bring our book value to \$890k. We are close to breaking \$900k. The market value for our fund is higher: > \$950k. The market value generates our annual DM disposable income. This year it is > \$46k, awarded to five students: (years received)

Wabash sports- The Wabash football team finished 8-3 on the season, 7-1 in the conference. They lost to DePauw 21-42 in the Monon Bell Game, with Wabash scoring 14 in the second half to DePauw's 28. Wabash did play in the Forever Green Bowl 23 Nov, losing to Hanover 10-13. The basketball team is now 4-4, 3-0 in the conference. Wrestling is 1-1, swimming/diving 3-1. Wrestling is 1-1 and won the Adrian Invitational. In the same week, basketball team routed DePauw in Greencastle 74-48 and the swim/dive team sank the Tigers at home 194-100.

New Community Center – has not yet started construction. Ground breaking is set for 25 January. Food operations were moved from the Sparks Center and opened in temporary facilities on the tennis courts on 11 December. The new facility is affectionately called "Grub Hollow", after mud hollow.
